CHAIRMAN'S RAMBLINGS...



We can look back over the past 12 months with pride with all that we as a Group have achieved.

With huge gratitude to Alistage and Dane Rawlins, who gave their time and expertise freely, we started the year being able to use our hydraulic ramp once again. The ramp had required some modifications to suit the new arena surface at Plumpton College.

Sheila Camilleri and I made a presentation at the South East Regional Conference on all that is wonderful about taking riders to Clwyd Special Riding Centre. As a result, we have now welcomed Val Eyres and her ride and drive pony Ossie into our Group, along with the return of Helen Waters with her established RDA pony Coco. We have been fortunate to welcome more volunteers too.

Also, during the Autumn Term a coach in training came to observe our sessions, instruction on safely using the hydraulic ramp was undertaken, and we encouraged our riders to enter the RDA National Creative Writing Competition. Izzy, one of our riders did and came 7th nationally. We congratulated Nicola Cramond on 25 years of volunteering with our Group. As is customary we ended with another wonderful Christmas Party with rosettes and, of course, cake by Jenny Brown.

2024 began with erratic weather — cold, then high winds, rain, interspersed with some fine weather. These conditions did not dampen the spirits of our riders and volunteers and the Spring Term saw fantastic riding achievements at every level. With nearly 100 years of volunteering between us Margaret Fogg and I enjoyed a small celebration in recognition of this feat. We arrived at Easter with a modernised website up and running, with thanks to Trustee Miranda Dart.

Summer Term kicked off with enthusiastic training for the Countryside Challenge competition that was to be held in May at Hickstead's hallowed showground.

We took three ponies and six riders. Our associate rider William Harris also competed on his own horse Ballysimon.

Our riders did extremely well, all gaining rosettes, with both Rhys and William Harris qualifying to compete at the National Championships at Hartpury College, Gloucestershire in July. The Trustees thank the South East Region team who organised this competition at Hickstead which gives riders this great opportunity to compete and widen their horizons.

Although the term had finished, there was still the National Championships. William and Ballysimon had four events over Friday and Saturday, and Rhys with Coco competed on Sunday.

All results can be found in this review.

Hartpury was special this year for me personally. I received the President's Award from HRH Princess Royal. This was the first time Princess Anne had taken on a public engagement since her accident and hospitalisation. It was a real honour for all of us at RDA that she should choose to make us her first public engagement, and a very special honour for all of us who were to receive an award.

Sadly, we were not able to attend Clwyd Special Riding Centre this year due to damage to the kitchen and clubhouse, but we are booked in for 2025.

We have a long-standing supporter in the form of Plumpton College who welcome us each week onto their campus. We have previously raised money to build the ground floor rooms by the arena- our clothing room, class room and tack room, and later the Sheila Blair Gallery and lift. Trustees have recently had meetings with Jeremy Kerswell, the Principal of Plumpton College, and his colleagues on how we can cement this partnership for the future.

As we require a larger equine to enable our growing riders to continue riding with us, without weight or height becoming a reason to leave, the Group is looking to purchase a horse that would live at the College for the use of Plumpton students during term time. This equine would be available to Hope in the Valley every Wednesday and for competitions when we needed it. This is an arrangement we have had in the past, which worked well for both the Group and the College. We are looking to raise money to support this vision so as not to dip into our reserves too much beyond what is earmarked.

We are also hoping to work more closely with the students who wish to enter the world of coaching and broaden their outlooks to include the requirements of coaching people with special needs.

Supporters of the Group have been kind throughout the year and we have been fortunate to receive donations of saddles and assorted tack for resale, a rug for Rose, generous financial gifts and money raised from other fund-raising efforts.

Over the year we have seen riders come and go. Some have only stayed a few weeks and some a little longer. We can feel disappointed that these young people choose to move on, but we can pride ourselves in the knowledge we enriched their lives during the time they rode with us.

In the past year all our riders have grown in their confidence and ability.

When we recognise achievement, it is there in many forms. Yes, it is the rosettes and certificates gained by riders and volunteers, but it is also our weekly joy of seeing riders smiling and appreciating the pony.

FINANCE: APRIL 2023 TO MARCH 2024

Hope in the Valley receives no external funding and is reliant on the generosity of its supporters.

We are now back up and running and in the second year after the enforced break due to the pandemic. We are grateful to the companies, societies and individuals who helped the Group in 2023-24. We had the benefit of significant donations from longstanding supporters and we continue to receive donations in place of riding fees from the parents of our child riders. We thank them all for their support.

We endeavour to spend our funds wisely and keep overheads to a minimum. Most of the Group expenditure was on the keep, care and transport of horses. We spent 83% on direct charitable expenses, 5% on income generation and 12% on administration.

During our financial year, we continued our recovery from past challenges which had curtailed our ability to provide the activities of which we are so proud. We came through 2023-24 stronger than ever and look forward to a bright future with new partnerships - which we hope will include a new group-owned horse, as well as cherishing our established relationships.

We continue to celebrate the achievement of all our riders and look forward to continuing to do so in 2024-25. Tony Pannett – Treasurer




